Cerebellum Removed and CranioSacral Therapy

Personal Information: 5 year old girl

History: She had her left cerebellum removed at age 4 (14 months prior) due to a growth which was causing dangerous pressure inside the head. She was walking and talking, but had a very low threshold for temper tantrums, was easily over stimulated and highly sensitive to her surroundings.

Previous Tx: N/A

Evaluation:

Findings: Her rhythm was stopped, the occiput - sacrum connection was very tense and contracted and the whole occiput area was in shock.

Tools used: We used cranial base release without the platform, unwinding of the neural cranium and dural tube decompression to allow a significant release of held tension and the rhythm to come on.

Objective results: Her interactions with others immediately became more harmonious.

Subjective results: She felt calmer.

Length of sessions: 45 minutes Number of sessions: Ongoing
